#### Possible challenges for young Europeans to find work abroad

#### 18-24 years-olds

- 22% of EU movers are early school leavers (vs. 8% of nationals);
- risk: limited employability and unstable jobs.

#### 25-35 years-olds

- 39% tertiary education vs. 43% nationals;
- only 3% in adult learning (EU target **60%** by 2030).

#### **NEETs** (18-29)

- **14%** movers vs. 11% nationals;
- risk of long-term exclusion.



Legal, economic and social challenges



#### **Unstable** contracts:

8% unemployment among movers aged 20-34.



#### Housing pressure:

**19%** spend > **40%** 

of income on housing (vs. 8% of nationals).
